More than a dozen members attended the archaeology meeting at Cam Peak car park on 26th May, after a brief briefing at Slimbridge Village Hall.

Peter Gibson explained that the object at the Peak was to dowse for pre-history graves of the Neolithic and Bronze Age periods, circa 7000 and 3000 BC respectively.

Beginners were shown the principles of this type of dowsing by Chairman Peter Golding, while the more experienced members dowsed in other designated areas. In total, we found indications of three Bronze Age round barrows (or dolmans), comprising stone circles with a slab roof. Several of us found indications of burials within.


Two Neolithic long barrows with two cruciform (cross-shaped) chambers were also indicated, and would have contained many bones.

Afterwards we repaired to the Railway Inn just down the hill, and enjoyed good food and an excellent discussion on all things dowsing, sitting in glorious sunshine in the garden.
