AGM News

We also received several votes by proxy, so that was well received. It was Rob Jewell's suggestion; thank you, Rob.

New Committee

The existing Committee was returned unopposed. As there had been no new nominations, this did not come as a major surprise. The only exception was for Vice Chairman. As you read in the October Newsletter, Jon Martin is stepping down to build a house, and Steve Sanderson was duly elected in his place. Welcome, Steve.

Thursday p.m. versus evening?

I am relieved to report that keeping Thursday afternoon meetings was carried unanimously, with no one in favour of changing to evenings. The deciding factor was the unlit car park, which is *behind* the hall, not beside it, and in pitch darkness.

... but Entry Fees increase

Although annual subscriptions remain the same, the AGM was asked to approve increasing our entry fees from £2 for members and £3 for guests to £3 and £4 respectively. This is still very reasonable, many groups now charge £5 entry.

The reasons for this are that the cost of hiring the hall has increased, and speakers are paid a fee plus reasonable travel expenses. The Meeting approved the increase, which will start in January 2015.

Archaeological Dowsing Section

After the AGM, Barry Goldring gave us an update on what the Archaeological Section has been up to. This should have been with PG2, but sadly he was absent.

One of the things Barry mentioned was Ros Milward's findings at St Augustine's Farm in Arlingham. She first dowsed a recent-ish Christian church building, beneath which she dowsed a Pagan church. Further dowsing gave indications of a stone henge and then a wood henge. And as if that wasn't enough, she went on to discover three ley lines intersecting at that very point. Now that's what you call dowsing!

Starting our own off-shoot Health & Healing Section was mooted last year when Di Holliday was still Chairman. There was a lot of interest, but it wasn't the right time.

Thursday 8th January

Using Double-V Rods to Find Water with Peter Golding.

The inventor of the Double -V rod, Clive Thompson, a retired architect and scientist, was President of the British Society of Dowsers from 1981 to 1987, and awarded the position of Honorary Life Vice-President. Clive considered that the single V-rod was limited in that it could only flip up or down, so he invented the Double-V dowsing rod in the 1980s. It has proved very useful for locating sources of groundwater and is accurate in the hands of someone who has mastered the technique of using it. Come along and master the technique yourselves.

Sacred Geometry Made Simple
with Trish Mills

Have I got news for you! This talk unfolds like a detective story. Discovering Sacred Geometry is like being handed the keys to the Universe. We begin — briefly — with the basic shapes that comply with nature's secret rules, and see via some amazing photographs how together they create harmony.

The ancients discovered all this way ahead of

us, and showed us how to calculate the size of the earth and the orbit of the planets with stunning accuracy. We also learn why the pyramids are comprised of nothing but triangles;

how Fibonacci worked out the formula for counting rabbits and stumbled on the secret of spirals; and how to make your own snowflake.

Once we've figured out all that, we take a look at how man has copied nature in music, architecture and art, and the sacred geometry in crop circles.

It's not just mind blowing – it's incendiary! You'll never look at the Universe in the same way again.

Thursday 12th February The Bosnian Pyramids with Lorraine Doherty*

Lorraine first heard about the Bosnian Pyramids some three years ago, and has been hooked ever since. Excavations are ongoing, mainly in the Ravne Tunnel, and Lorraine has led groups to visit the valley of Visoko, home of the Bosnian Pyramid of the Sun and Archaeological Park,

and to experience the energy there. Her original interest was in the Runes, and she has found marks within the Ravne Tunnel that seem to communicate in a similar way.

Lorraine will bring samples of the stones from the pyramids, and recordings of their vibrations, which lends credence to the suggestion that they were massive transformers or generators for the energy system that lies beneath them.



Saturday 28th February **Labyrinths** with Jeff Saward*

First captivated by the labyrinth in 1976, Jeff Saward is a world authority on the history and development of labyrinths and mazes, and is the author of Magical Paths, a pictorial essay on the modern revival, and Labyrinths & Mazes, a comprehensive illustrated history. He is also the editor of Caerdroia – the Journal of Mazes and Labyrinths, and co-founder and director of Labyrinthos, the Labyrinth Resource Centre, Photo Library and Archive.

Travelling extensively to research the history of labyrinths and mazes, Jeff has an unrivalled collection of photographs from around the world and is frequently consulted to provide designs, information, illustrations and documentation for both modern construction projects and historical restorations. Psychometric Dowsing with Geoff Brooks*

Psychometry is the ability to receive clairvoyant impressions of the history of an object.



This session will include the opportunity to experience psychometry for yourself. Please bring your pendulum or rods, and a small personal item for this purpose. This skill will bring new insights into your downing activities.

Dowsing, as we know, is the ability to find hidden targets and unknown information through intuition. Dowsing instruments are simply a means of amplifying the human body's response to information contained in the subtle energy field of the planet.

The psychologist Carl Gustav Jung described the information from this energy field as the collective unconscious mind. He used metaphoric imagery received in the dream state as the basis for his psychotherapy.
