This is a two-part Water Divining Workshop, in conjunction with the British Society of Dowsers' Water & Site Dowsing Group (WSDG).



Rediscovering Avebury Henge

On **Saturday 27th February 2010** Maria Wheatley will give a talk about Avebury, one of the largest stone circles in the world. Co-author with Busty Taylor of *Avebury – Sun, Moon and Earth*, Maria has rediscovered several long-lost astronomical alignments, unnoticed for 4,500 years. The celestial alignments were skilfully integrated into the megalithic architecture creating one of the most unusual alignments in Northern Europe.

Using sensitive electromagnetic detecting equipment, the frequency of certain energy lines was determined, as well as proving the existence of megalithic energy transmitted by the standing stones.

Knowledge of earth energies was handed down to medieval Masons and Knights Templar who secretly integrated lines of force into their holy constructs. Many churches around Avebury have power points and we shall see how these influence the aura.

Dowsing the Three Perpetual Choirs of Britain

It wasn't until author John Gibson-Forty received a telephone call in 1999 from a professional French Horn player, that he had even heard of the Celtic phenomenon known as the Three Perpetual Choirs of Britain.

Believed to comprise 2,400 monks or saints, the Choirs' role was to chant perpetually on a rolling rota basis, 100 at a time, night and day, in order to maintain the ongoing enchantment of Britain.

Initially unaware that this would lead to a better understanding and insight of the interconnectness of all things, John has devoted ten years to intensive research, three and a half years of which he spent dowsing the lines of the Decagon (a 10-sided, 10-pointed figure), not as they are in the present day but how they were 2,000 years ago. At 130 miles across, covering 22 counties and 14,000 square miles, that's a lot of dowsing!
